- 1) There shall be no burning of any building materials dimensional lumber that has been processed for construction purposes or for those items that may contain potentially toxic materials such as but not limited to: creosote, pressure treated lumber or products that are painted or stained.
- 2) Other items such as but not limited to: asphalt or fiberglass roofing materials, tires, trash, garage or other household refuse MAY NOT be burned (this includes burning in fire pits).
- 3) A fire must be attended at all times and shall be kept contained to a safe and manageable size. A manageable size fire is a fire that can be controlled with either hose, pails of water, shovels and rakes. A minimum of 5 gallons of water or a fire extinguisher must be present at all times during burning.
- 4) You will be subject to FINES and penalties BY THE DNR FOR FIRES THAT BECOME OUT OF CONTROL.

FIRE DANGER RATINGS:

LOW: Fires are not easily started. Campfires are allowed

MODERATE: Fires start easily and spread at a moderate rate.

HIGH: Fires start easily and spread at a fast rate. Debris burning is not allowed. Campfires are allowed. Extra attention will be required to watch your campfire and keep it under control.

BURN BAN: Fire danger is explosive, fires spread at a very fast rate and burn intensely. NO fires are allowed at any time for any reason. This includes "CAMPFIRES".

These rules and regulations do not supersede any other rules and regulations imposed by court order, township, county, state, or federal laws and regulations. Any court order or township, county, state, and federal laws and must be complied with are the responsibility of the property owner in regards to knowledge compliance.
